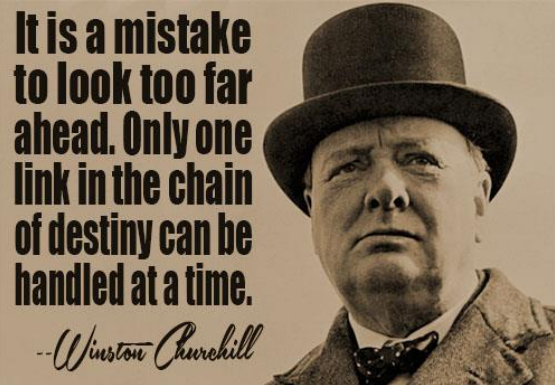


Dear parents, carers and children
